School Uniform 2019-20

There will be a revised school uniform for the academic year 2019-20. Parents/carers will be provided with **one** of each of the following items **free of charge** for the academic year, **five** free of charge items in total.

Navy blue badged jumper
White badged polo shirt
Black badged Canterbury coat
Black badged micro fleece
Black/red badged rugby top or Black/red badged polo shirt

Main Uniform - may be purchased through any store

Black school trousers. These should be smart, full length, regular fit or
Black school skirt that is pleated all the way around. This should be worn with black opaque tights.
Formal black dress shoes, not trainers (or anything that resembles trainers) or boots. Shoes must be polishable over their entire surface with a traditional sole.

Main Uniform - available exclusively at Emblematic

Navy blue badged jumpers Years 7–11
White badged polo shirt Years 7–11
Black badged Canterbury Coat (*see note below)
Black badged micro fleece (optional)

*The only school coat that may be worn is the Canterbury Coat. This must be worn on the journey to and from school between October half term and February half term. It may be worn with the micro fleece only.

Please ensure you know which year group your child will be part of in Sept 2019 when ordering as each year group has a designated colour for the outer logo circle. The school jumper logo is on a navy blue background and polo shirt logo is on a white background (as shown below).

PE Uniform - may be purchased through any store

- Sturdy trainers (not boots, plimsolls or fashion/leisure shoes)
- Plain black shorts
- Plain red football socks
- Football boots with moulded studs only

School Shoes - may be purchased through any store

Formal black dress shoes, no trainers (or anything that resembles trainers) or boots. Shoes must be polishable over their entire surface with a traditional sole.

Shopping Advice

Please be aware that many major stores market a lot of shoes, trousers and skirts as part of their 'school uniform' range. This does not automatically mean that these items are suitable for school. Please follow the advice and examples of acceptable school wear in the uniform booklet closely. If you are in doubt, please contact Mrs. C Walker (Yrs 7–9) or Mr. D Merrifield (Yrs 10–11) prior to making a purchase. Emblematic now offer a school skirt and trousers that meet the school requirements.

Hairstyles, Religious Headwear, Jewellery, Make-up

- Hair must be a natural colour only and hairstyles are not to follow extremes of fashion such as shaved heads, tramlines, patterns, dyed hair etc
- Natural looking make-up only
- No false nails/nail varnish or false eye lashes are to be worn
- The only jewellery allowed to be worn is a watch and one plain ear stud in each earlobe only
- Religious headwear must be completely plain (no patterns) and one colour—black, blue or white only. Religious headwear specifically designed for sport is available to order from Emblematic.

Students arriving at school in incorrect uniform

Any student arriving to school in what we consider incorrect uniform will work in isolation unless the issue can be corrected, for example, changing shoes or removing jewellery. This rule is not negotiable and applies to all students.

The school does not accept notes or letters from parents/carers to excuse students from wearing full school uniform.

Any student that is unable to wear full school uniform due to a medical condition will need to supply the school with a suitable letter from a medical professional explaining how wearing uniform would negatively affect their condition. For ongoing issues, such a letter would need to be renewed at the start of each academic year.
